Email client	The program or service you use to send your emails (NGP, ActionKit, Action Network, Gmail)
Deliverability	The likelihood of your email landing in your audience's inbox
Open rate	Percentage of your audience that has opened your email
Click rate	Percentage of your audience that has clicked on your email
Segmentation	Tailoring your content to a specific target audience
EOM, EOQ, EOY	"End of month," "End of quarter," "End of year"

Lauren —


11 years ago, I was shot.

The bullet damaged the left hemisphere of my brain, where the language function sits. Ever since, Aphasia has been a part of my life. When I speak, the words are there. It's just hard for me to get them out.

Aphasia makes it harder for me to speak. But I have not lost my voice.

With a lot of practice, I have found new ways to communicate. Through it all, Mark has been my rock. At every step of my journey, he has been there — pushing me, supporting me, and making me laugh. Now, it's my turn to help him.

I know a thing or two about tough campaigns. And I can tell you one thing for sure: This one is going to be close.



But here's the reality, Lauren:



As a Mexican-American and first-generation college student at the University of Iowa, I've had a front-row seat to the issues my generation will inherit if we don't make a change now.

My friends and I have been dealing with the fallout from our leaders' inaction on gun violence since we were children.

As the granddaughter of immigrants, I have seen the discrimination and difficulty that many new Americans face when they arrive in this country.

Ever since my team found out that the Honorable Marty Walsh would be joining us for our Hall of Fame Celebration, they've been perfecting their Boston accents and drinking lots of Dunkin' coffee in preparation for his visit. (Fun fact: Mr. Walsh's first job was as a doughnut finisher.)

I'm Eric Van Lancker and I'm running alongside Deidre DeJear to flip Iowa's governor's seat blue this fall.


Can I count on you to chip in \$24.30 today and show your support for folks putting people over politics?


Drink some water, get some sunlight, and take care of yourself – we need you in this fight.
